

August 1st, 1998 in the Flagstar "Plaza" 5 – 12 PM


Entertainment includes a Swiss band, the Dorman High School Band, an Alphorn performance and dancing. There will also be a fireworks display. Food and beverages will be available.

Lake Louise Banff 7rip -- Feb. 20 - 27. 1999

Everyone should have their Lake Louise/Banff trip application. Please get your application in to LTA as quickly as possible. We have 40 spaces (20 rooms) booked and this is split evenly (based on our survey) between lodging at (1)Chateau Lake Louise/Banff Springs hotels and staying at the (2)Banff Park Lodge. We currently have 5 1/2 rooms taken out of 10 for option 1 (Chateau/Springs) and a half room taken out of 10 booked for option 2(Banff Park). Those who know which option they wish to choose need to get their reservation in to LTA to avoid disappointment.

Our air carrier is Delta leaving out of Greenville/Spartanburg @ 6:30 AM Saturday 2/20/99 arriving in Calgary Alberta (2 hour time change) around 11:05 AM putting us in Banff mid afternoon. Our return is scheduled for 1:07 PM Saturday 2/27/99 out of Calgary arriving back in Greenville/Spartanburg around 11:05 PM. These are the tentative flight times which will normally change somewhat during seven months before we leave.

The price for the Chateau Lake Louise/Banff Springs Hotels is \$1176 (Land only \$726) and for the Banff Park Lodge is \$901 (Land only \$451). There is a \$35/\$20 refundable GST Tax included in both the above options. Because we are less than 25 at each hotel these refunds need to be handled by each individual. However, if LTA can get the 25 minimum waved they will get our refunds. The total price is for air fare, lodging, ground transfers and park fee.

Currently one US dollar will buy 1.47 Canadian dollars. When we went to Whistler in 1996 the exchange was about 1.35. The way to get the best exchange rate is to use a major credit card for your purchases.
