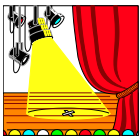

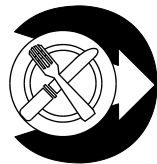

## Music On Main

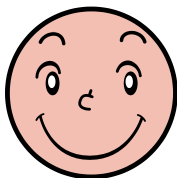

## **CRESCENT EXCOMM MEETS BY TELECONFERENCE**

On Saturday, June 19, 1999, the members of the Crescent Executive Committee met by teleconference to set the agenda for the 1999-2000 year. We welcomed Jo Widener (ETMM) as Crescent's new database director. Among the items discussed were Crescent's policy on trip participant membership in Clubs, progress on this year's Directory, the budget for the upcoming year, updating Crescent's logo to include Florida, status of weekend trips, and distribution of The Skiliner to vendors. The Committee also decided that the Winter 2000 Board Meeting will be held during the Canaan Valley, WV race and ski weekend. Furthermore, the Committee expressed its desire to continue holding its Fall Conference in Boone, NC for so long as Appalachian Ski Mountain is willing to be our gracious host! The meeting lasted about an hour and a half and greatly reduced the expenses normally incurred for summer ExComm meetings. ## **THIS COULD NEVER HAPPEN TO ME??**

Mike Milligan is the Division One Race Director. Sharon Milligan is the Score Keeper for Division One. Both have been involved with the Crescent Ski Council (CSC) for a number of years. They have donated their time and money to the successful operation of the CSC Race Series and the Catawba Valley Ski Club. Mike and Sharon have two young daughters, Mikala and Ashley, 4 years old and 14 months old, respectively.

The tragedy that has occurred to this family has brought tears to my eyes and to those of many other CSC members. While skiing at Vail, Colorado in mid-April, Mike somehow lost control and went crashing

into a tree. The injuries that Mike sustained were quite severe. Mike crushed his right ankle, crushed his right elbow, compressed a disk in his back, and received several small fractures in his pelvis. Mike was admitted to the Vail hospital. Cables were put into his elbow to hinge the elbow back into place. Screws and pins were used to secure the broken bones in his ankle and a fixator was placed around his ankle, with metal rods going through his ankle. After about a week, Mike was medivac'd to the Hickory, North Carolina hospital where he stayed for approximately another week. Mike was then sent home and could only lie in bed or recline in a chair.

A few days later Sharon, Mikala, and Ashley were on a short trip near Winston-Salem. A tire blew-out on the van that Sharon was driving and caused an accident. Sharon was not injured, thanks to the air bag, but their two daughters were. Mikala's spinal cord was severed at T2, and three or four additional vertebra had to be fused together. Ashley bruised her spine and two or three of her vertebra had to be fused together. For the past seven weeks both girls have had "halos" on their heads to stabilize their spinal cords. Both Mikala and Ashley experienced respiratory problems during their recovery time at WFUBMC and both were receiving feeding supplements through a feeding tube. The girls have been medivac'd to the DuPont Pediatric Neurological Rehabilitation Center in Delaware for extensive rehabilitation. Mikala and Ashley will probably receive treatment at the DuPont Center for approximately eight weeks then return to Hickory, North Carolina.

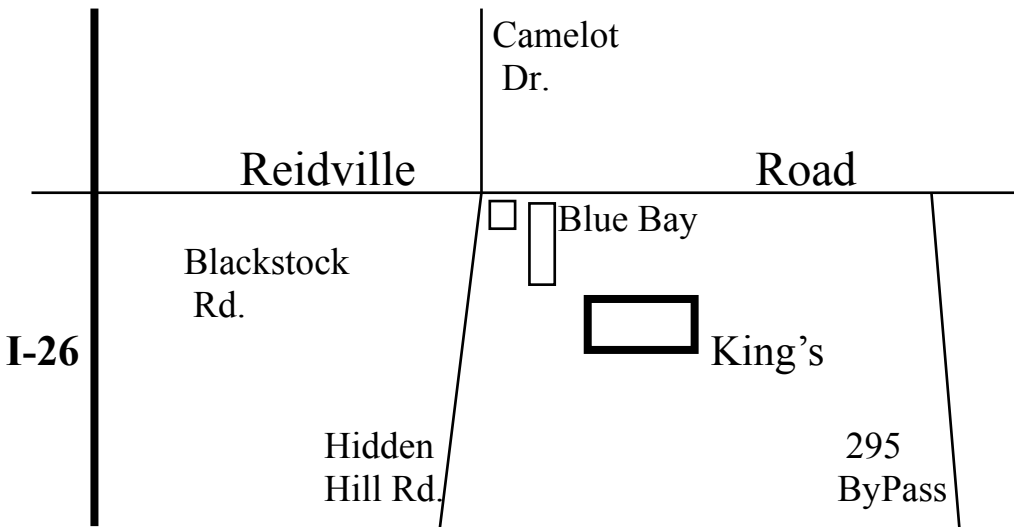
