24th ANNIVERSARY STEAMBOAT RACE CAMP/SKI SCHOOL TRIP 2007

SIGN-UP: All applicants must be a member of a Crescent Ski Council affiliated club at time of the trip to participate. Applicant's membership will be verified by CSC. Everyone must sign-up directly with our travel agent, Sports America Tours (SAT) in Santa Rosa, CA. SAT will require a filled out & signed application form to be confirmed onto the trip. Checks must be made payable to SAT.

SIGN-UP PERIOD: Sign-up period begins May 28, 2007 and ends November 12, 2007. SAT will not accept any form of application for sign-up prior to, nor after this period.

TRIP DATES: December 1-8, 2007

PACKAGE COST(VARIES): \$820 is the "base" rate in a 3B/3B unit, which is limited in quantity (usually about 120 spaces). Other rates/options are available (see below).

Raft n' Rail Saturday, August 25th The train leaves the depot in Bryson City at 10:30 am SHARP



Join us on an adventure of your choice with the Great Smoky Mountain Railroad or, if you want an added adventure, go rafting with Wildwater Limited.

The train will take us 22 miles along the foothills of the Smokies and up the Nantahala River Gorge. Those wishing to raft will disembark and continue on a 2 hour "family-friendly" raft down the river. Lunch will be provided for us, and then the river rafters will be shuttled back to the Bryson City depot. If you only want to do the rail portion, you will disembark at the raft put-in location and spend about one hour in the Gorge. You will then be taken by train back to the Bryson City Depot. All tickets include admission to the Smoky Mountain Trains Museum in Bryson City.

** The cost for the rail portion only is \$40 per adult, \$20 per child **

** Rail and raft together is \$74 per adult, \$57 per child **

(child must be at least 7 years old and weigh 60 lbs in order to raft). Guides are available for an additional \$5 per person, per raft.
