
A FABULOUS FALL!!





The Texas Ski Council (TSC), Florida Ski Council (FSC), and Aspen Skiing Company hosted the Second Annual National Ski Council Summit Conference at Snowmass, Colorado, on August 28-29, 1998. TSC's Anne Myers chaired, and FSC's Kim Miller co-chaired, the

conference and the meeting where representatives of the thirteen councils in attendance voted unanimously to form the National Ski Council Federation (NSCF). Ms. Miller, of the Florida Ski Council, was elected the first president of NSCF.

At the Summit Conference, council representatives shared information about the organization and operation of their councils and trip programs. Bob Wilbanks, publisher of the National Ski Club Newsletter, and Richard Davidson. Board Member of the Swiss National Tourist Bureau, also attended all meetings of the council representatives. The council representatives then met with representatives of travel agencies to discuss areas of mutual concern regarding the planning bidding process. marketing and operation of ski vacations. This was followed by a meeting between council representatives and ski area representatives where similar discussions were held. Finally, council representatives, travel agents and ski area representatives all met together.

At the combined meeting, the ski areas, led by Lake Louise's Sandy Best and Aspen Skiing Company's Kris McKinnon, agreed to develop a program of incentives to encourage first-time skiers to try the sport. All agreed that such a program could help clubs by bringing in more members and help ski resorts and travel agents by developing more customers. Some of the possible incentives discussed included free equipment rental and lessons and lift tickets. A report on the implementation of the program is anticipated in late 1998.


