

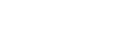
gives us a rough estimate so the restaurant will know how many to set for.

## CLUB REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD MAKE PLANS TO ATTEND SPRING BOARD MEETING TO APPROVE NEW CRESCENT CLUB

The next meeting of the Board of Directors of the Crescent Ski Council will be held at the Sea Mist Resort in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, on Sunday, April 25, 1999. The most important new item of business to be discussed and voted upon will be the application for membership recently filed by the Triangle Sports & Outings Club, Inc. (Durham/Chapel Hill, North Carolina) ("TSOC"), which many of the Crescent veterans will know was formerly known as the Durham-Chapel Hill Ski & Sports Club.

TSOC currently has about 230 members: members generally are from Durham (55%), Chapel Hill (25%), Raleigh/Cary (15%), and other cities (5%). About 40% of TSOC's members are avid skiers, and 5% (12+/- skiers) want to race with Crescent! Twenty percent of TSOC's members enjoy cross-country skiing. In the off-season, TSOC sponsors beach trips, bowling, camping and hiking, white water rafting, golf and tennis, bike trips and other activities.

From 1969 to 1994, TSOC was a member of Crescent. In 1994, it chose not to renew membership in Crescent to focus its efforts on attracting more non-skiing members. In response to its members (who now want more ski trips!), TSOC filed its membership application with Crescent on February 28. When the Crescent Board reviews TSOC's application for membership, it will also determine whether TSOC, if accepted as a member, will be a Full or Associate (non-voting) member of Crescent.

#### UPDATE ON CRESCENT'S TREASURY

Thanks to the efforts of Alan Lange (Cape Fear). Crescent Ski Council's Treasurer, financial reporting for Crescent's activities and budgeting for the upcoming year are progressing smoothly. We now have Crescent-wide budgets and accounting systems in place. In addition, Crescent filed its Federal informational tax return (Form 990-EZ) with the IRS for its fiscal year ended May 31, 1998 Effective November 20, 1998, in January. Crescent purchased an Employee Dishonesty and Forgery/Alteration insurance policy issued by Travelers Casualty and Surety Co. of America. The policy's limit is \$100,000, with a \$1,000 deductible on dishonesty coverage and no deductible on forgery/alteration coverage. Cost of the insurance is \$218 annually. Finally, Alan is busy assembling information from Crescent's 1997-98 fiscal year for review by an independent person within Crescent and hopes to have this review completed by the Spring Board Meeting.
