Excitement is building for the January 16-23rd trip to Whitefish, MT. Whitefish is a small historic town centered around skiing and celebrating its 100th anniversary. It's 18 miles from the Kalispell (FCA) airport, which is serviced by Northwest/Delta and United. Originally called Big Mountain, this is one of the ten biggest resorts in the U.S.A.. The slopes are all mingled with 20% green, 50% blue and 30% black, not including tree skiing. The peak is at 7,000 feet and has a 2,353 vertical drop. Options may include skiing a day in Fernie, Canada, cross country skiing or snowshoeing in Glacier National Park and snowmobiling or dog sledding outside the park.
