SOUP KITCHEN DONATIONS

A great big thank you goes to those members who were in attendance for the February meeting and brought donations for the Spartanburg Soup Kitchen. We filled up a large grocery cart with our donations – and that was with half of our normal number of persons attending the meeting. I have never been to the Soup Kitchen, and during my visit I learned a few things:

- They serve 500-600 meals daily and on Wednesdays they can serve up to 1000 meals.
- They have a children's area for children to eat away from the adults.
- Persons can come in and ask for food to take home.
- Their canned good storage areas could almost take on any grocery store with the number of cans that they have and in their methods of organization.
- They have freezers and refrigerators all over the place. So are the canned good and boxed food areas.
- They get donations from grocery stores, especially meats and bakery items that are a few days before their expiration date. They also receive produce items.
- They are anxious to move into their new space.

So, we made the ladies at the Soup Kitchen very happy. Thanks to all who contributed!

SSOC Trip Rules and Trip Policies

- 1) All trip participants must be in good standing with the SSOC and/or Crescent Ski Council.
- 2) When required, each applicant must submit a signed registration form, along with a deposit, to the Trip Director or Tour Operator for events.
- 3) All checks should be made payable to SSOC, Crescent Ski Council or the Tour Operator, as specified.
- 4) Checks returned to SSOC for non-sufficient funds, will be charged \$10, plus any bank charges incurred for each check. These fees will be paid immediately or member forfeits participation in any Club activity until the fee is paid.
- 5) Unruly behavior will not be tolerated.
- 6) Once a trip is filled, a Waiting List will be established giving priority to registered applicants who have paid deposits. All monies must be paid in full prior to participating in any SSOC or Crescent event.
- 7) When a trip application is submitted, a trip applicant may opt to provide his/her own airfare, but must adhere to the Land Package choices provided by the Tour Operator. This includes lodging, paid activities, any ground transportation, or anything not considered "optional" on the schedule.
- 8) The Club is not liable for any financial losses, property damage, or personal injury due to weather conditions or other events. Refund policies established by any Provider or Facility will be upheld by SSOC.
- 9) Single participants requiring a roommate will be informed of the availability of others seeking a roommate. In the event a suitable person is not available, the participant will agree to pay a "Single Supplement" or other rooming arrangement at the discretion of the Tour Operator. Unless it is elected by both parties, no two people of the opposite sex will be assigned to the same room.
- 10) Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult, who must sign an agreement of responsibility for the child.
- 11) The Board (at any regular or special meeting) reserves the right to revise or clarify Club Rules by a majority vote.
